Land Use in the CCA

The CCA is involved in many land use proposals and projects in our neighbourhood to ensure the best interests of our community are being met. We work with a wide range of parties, including individual developers, large institutions, and planners from the Municipality of Saanich. Below is an outline of some recent land use projects in the CCA. Hillside Liquor Store

An application to rezone the property at 1664 North Dairy Road and consolidate with the existing Hillside Liquor Store is pending. The proposal is being worked on and the applicants hope to have the application before Saanich Council later this year. Stay tuned to the CCA website for updates.

Camosun College Antennas

An application to extend the telecommunications tower on the Fisher Building at Camosun College has been withdrawn. Community opposition to the proposal by Telus and WindMobile had been strong due to concerns surrounding health risks associated with wireless radiation. The applicants may proceed with the installation of smaller antenna structures at the Fisher Building that would not require public input.

Summer Picnic Cancelled

Unfortunately, the CCA has had to cancel the 2013 Summer Family Picnic as we do not have enough volunteers to help organize and put on the games, activities and BBQ. Shelbourne Community Kitchen


Several community groups including local churches, businesses, organizations, and the neighbouring Mount Tolmie Community Association have been working together to establish a community kitchen in the Shelbourne Valley. Earlier this year the group received an operating grant from the Lutheran National Church office to support this community initiative. The project is still in its planning phases, but a kitchen is expected to open in September. The location has not been confirmed but will be somewhere in the Shelbourne area.

The Shelbourne Community Kitchen will not act as a traditional soup kitchen but will focus on addressing many of the larger food security issues in the community. In addition to providing food for those in need, the group hopes to improve food literacy and become a food support resource centre. Cooking and nutrition education is being considered as part of the kitchen's programs. Long-term goals include the possibility of a food garden.

The Camosun Community Association is supporting this initiative as it is expected to provide a positive space for community members and help foster sense of community in the Shelbourne Valley.

Cedar Hill Clay Court Proposal

A proposal has been submitted by the Cedar Hill Clay Court Tennis Society (CHCCTS), a private tennis club, to build an 8 court tennis facility on public land behind (south/west) the Cedar Hill Rec Center. In exchange for the land the society has offered Saanich 1500 hours of court time per year & \$20,000 towards work on Bowker Creek. This proposal will go before Saanich Council sometime in the future.

Saanich Recreation, Trails & Parks Advisory Committee has endorsed this proposal whereas the Saanich Environmental Advisory Committee has asked the CHCCTS to look for a different site. Their concerns are that the site: is close to Bowker Creek, has a high environmental & ecological value, is identified in the Bowker Creek Blueprint as a valuable part of the Bowker Creek watershed, and is also the location of restoration work that supports the diversity of natural vegetation & wildlife in the area. Concerns expressed by the public include: inadequate availability of information from Saanich about this proposal, loss of the existing ball fields & community free play area, re-routing of the existing chip trail, the effect of night court lights on the neighborhood & wildlife, public land being handed over to a private organization and limitation of future remedial work on Bowker Creek.

The initial plan was for the tennis courts to be clay, but the site is too wet, so the latest plans are for the eight courts to have a gravel surface instead.
