

Shelbourne Community Kitchen

You may be surprised to learn that on Shelbourne Street, near the Shelbourne Plaza, is a small house that is providing big support to families in our community who lack adequate access to healthy food. Their mission is to provide nutritious food in a nurturing and educational environment, for individuals and families living on low income. What makes the Shelbourne Community Kitchen unique is its mission to provide a supportive place to learn and work together as a community. This is accomplished through three key initiatives:

- Providing access to healthy food
- Working with others to prepare and share nutritious meals together
- Developing gardens where people work together to grow food for themselves and others

As mentioned in the Saanich News last Fall, the Kitchen "looks to fill a growing need" in our community. It's supported by five key partners, including the Camosun Community Association, along with many volunteers who believe in the shared vision of food security for all members of our community through caring, empathy, mutual respect, and cooperation.

Land Use in the CCA

The CCA is involved in many land use proposals and plans in our neighbourhood to ensure the interests of our community are being met. Make sure to check the CCA and Saanich websites for up-to-date information. Below is an update of some current plans and projects in the Camosun Community.

1780 Townley Street

The Greater Victoria Housing Society (GVHS) proposal for Townley Lodge was postponed by Saanich Council in October 2016. Since then, the GVHS has been working with neighbours and the CCA to come up with new design options. The project is expected to move forward with a redesigned 3-storey and 11-townhouse proposal sometime this year.

1586-1592 North Dairy Road

Abstract Developments are looking to develop the four properties along North Dairy Road between Keats and Wordsworth. No design has been put forward yet, but Abstract is expected to propose a 4-storey condominium project for the site. The developer has been meeting with neighbours and hopes to submit an application with Saanich this spring. Plans will be posted on the CCA website when made available.

Shelbourne Valley Action Plan

Saanich Council endorsed a short-term mobility option for the Shelbourne Valley Action Plan on December 5th, 2016. This option recommends cycling infrastructure along Shelbourne Street for its entire length through the Valley as well as maintaining four lanes of vehicular traffic through the CCA. The full Action Plan will be heading to Council for approval this spring. 
Board of Directors
